



I do present unto you lessons 29 through 32. In the course of our daily lives, we must necessarily deal with a myriad of folk, in our own households, in the marketplace, any number of craftsmen, merchants, servants, and so forth. Most of these people have a title that befits his or her trade or skill and station in life. Knowing one's place and social order in life was very important; even servants could consider themselves a bit above the common tenant farmer, and the freeman would think himself much better off than a serf, bound to a lord and his land.

Note also that many of these designations for professions or trades over time became surnames; John the Fletcher, who made arrows, became John Fletcher, while the barrel-maker, William, became William Cooper, as just two examples.

Factor Does business for you in London, or in another country.
Nurse Takes care of infants and young children.
Wet Nurse Breast feeds the baby (as long as the first two years).

- Acater The agent you hire to order and buy food or goods you do not supply from your own estates. (This root word gives us the modern term “caterer”.)
- Warrener The man who catches rabbits on your land. (Rabbits live in warrens.)
- Fowler The man who supplies game birds for your table.
- Cocker The man who handles the birds at cock fighting.
- Sawyer The man you contract with for sawn wooden planks (and so on) for building.
- Turner The person the joiner buys lathe-turned items from, such as table legs, finials, etc.



Shakespearian Words/Phrases to use:

Minikin – shrill or petty
 “God save us from that minikin tone he doth use to trumpet his own virtues.”

Passing – extremely or exceedingly
 “Saw you her garb? I’truth, what some will wear is passing strange.”

Vile – Low, cheap or worthless
 “My purse be so near to empty that I must content myself with vile ale.”

Barm – The froth or foam on fermenting ale or beer, containing yeasts
 “Betake the barm and use it to leaven the bread.”


